Dr. Alexandra Stoddart is an Assistant Professor in the Health, Outdoor and Physical Education (HOPE) subject area in the Faculty of Education at the University of Regina. Before joining the U of R as a faculty member in January 2018, she completed her Ph.D. in Kinesiology at the University of Saskatchewan. Alexandra currently teaches HOPE undergraduate courses in both the Elementary and Secondary programs. She enjoys the opportunity to see her students learn, grow, and thrive as they engage in their pre-internship and internship experiences.

Dr. Stoddart's research is focused on physical literacy, physical education pedagogy, and the physical education curriculum using both qualitative and quantitative research methods. Specifically, her primary research area is exploring the concept of physical literacy and its development through quality physical education in elementary schools. She works collaboratively with teachers, students, and



researchers in K-12 schools to explore these topics. She is currently funded by the Saskatchewan Instructional and Development Research Unit (SIDRU) to explore post-internship students' understanding of physical literacy and its connection to the Saskatchewan K-12 physical education curriculum.
